Dedicated to excellence in education, Dr. Martin served for several years as the Academic Division Chief of Neonatology at the University of Arizona Medical School. Currently, he is an Associate Professor within the school's Department of Child Health. Dr. Martin is a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics and holds memberships with the Section on Perinatal Pediatrics and the District VIII Perinatal Section. He is a peer reviewer of the Journal of Perinatology and has written and presented extensively on neonatology.

Dr. Martin completed his residency at North Shore University Hospital in Manhasset, N.Y., and a fellowship at The Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York City. He graduated with his medical degree from the New York University School of Medicine.
