

- Phoenix Children's represents Arizona's indispensable pediatric health network, providing pediatric inpatient, outpatient, urgent care, emergency and trauma services. Last year, Phoenix Children's had **18,773** inpatient admissions; **80,514** visits to the Emergency Department; **237,514** outpatient visits; and **16,491** surgical cases.
- Phoenix Children's offers world-class care in more than **75** subspecialty fields of pediatric medicine, including **6** Centers of Excellence (listed at right).
- Phoenix Children's is one of the largest children's hospitals in the country with **433** licensed beds. Inpatient services are available on the main campus and at Dignity Health Mercy Gilbert Medical Center, which offers 24/7 hospitalist coverage for East Valley families.
- US News & World Report* Best Children's Hospitals honored **10** Phoenix Children's programs in 2016-17 – Cancer; Cardiology/Heart Surgery; Neurosurgery/Neurology; Orthopedics; Diabetes/Endocrinology; Gastroenterology/GI Surgery; Pulmonology; Urology; Neonatology and Nephrology.
- Phoenix Children's Hospital is a Leapfrog Group Top Children's Hospital – **one of only 12** in the nation honored for patient safety, quality and value. With **more than 1,200** institutions under consideration, this distinction is by far one of the most coveted awards a hospital can earn.
- Phoenix Children's Hospital is part of Phoenix Children's Care Network, an organization with **more than 800** physician members – including **222** general pediatricians from across the Valley – whose focus is on improving quality and managing health care costs.
- There are **more than 8,000** high-risk births in Arizona annually. **Arizona Fetal Care Network** at Phoenix Children's Hospital is the only program in the state offering advanced fetal diagnosis and newborn medical and surgical intervention, all at one location.
- With **4,191** staff members, Phoenix Children's is among the **40** largest employers in Arizona. In 2014 alone, Phoenix Children's hired 1,033 new employees.
- Phoenix Children's operates satellite centers in **Mesa, Scottsdale, the Northwest Valley, Avondale, Yuma, and Flagstaff**, bringing Phoenix Children's special brand of care closer to home.

Centers of Excellence

- The Children's Heart Center**, which integrated with Arizona Pediatric Cardiology in 2014, is the premier cardiac referral center in the Southwest and the fifth largest program of its kind in the country. It is home to a state-of-the-art cardiac catheterization laboratory and is the only location offering pediatric "hybrid" procedures in the Southwest.
- Barrow Neurological Institute at Phoenix Children's Hospital** operates the Pediatric Epilepsy Monitoring Unit, where epileptologists monitor children experiencing all types of seizures. Real-time data gathered from EEG and video recordings at the moment of seizure help these specialists plan the best course of treatment.
- The Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders'** Ottosen Family Blood and Marrow Transplant (BMT) Program, in partnership with Mayo Clinic in Arizona, is second among all US BMT programs for one-year survival rates.
- With ten fellowship-trained physicians now employed, the **Center for Pediatric Orthopedics** provides expert care for children and teens with fractures, sports-related injuries, hip disorders, muscular dystrophy, cerebral palsy, spinal deformities, clubfoot, and a variety of other musculoskeletal conditions. In 2015, the center opened the Hospital's first gait and motion analysis lab that will help guide and monitor the course of treatment for many orthopedic patients.
- The Hospital's **ACS-verified Level 1 Pediatric Trauma Center** treated **2,588** kids in 2014. Thanks to a **\$10 million** gift from the Kemper and Ethel Marley Foundation – the largest single gift ever made to the Hospital – Phoenix Children's is building a new Emergency Department and Trauma Center, a growth initiative that prepares the Hospital to continue serving the Valley's burgeoning pediatric population.
- The Newborn Intensive Care Unit (NICU)** at Phoenix Children's is a **Level IIIc nursery**, which offers the most skilled level of care and represents the highest certification given by the Arizona Perinatal Trust. Each year, hundreds of babies from across the Southwest are admitted to this intensive care nursery to receive the excellent care it provides.
