

- Phoenix Children's represents Arizona's indispensable pediatric health network, providing pediatric inpatient, outpatient, urgent care, emergency and trauma services. Last year, Phoenix Children's had **13,291** inpatient admissions; **86,058** visits to the Emergency Department; **298,410** outpatient visits; and **16,815** surgical cases.
- Phoenix Children's offers world-class care in **more than 75** subspecialty fields of pediatric medicine, including **6** Centers of Excellence (listed on the right).
- Phoenix Children's is one of the largest children's hospitals in the country with 433 licensed beds. Inpatient services are available on the main campus and at Dignity Health Mercy Gilbert Medical Center, which offers **24/7** hospitalist coverage for East Valley families.
- US News and World Report Best Children's Hospitals honored **7** Phoenix Children's programs in 2017-18 – Cancer; Cardiology/Heart Surgery; Gastroenterology/GI surgery; Nephrology; Neurosurgery/Neurology; Orthopedics; and Urology.
- Phoenix Children's Hospital is part of Phoenix Children's Care Network, an organization with more than **1,000** physician members whose focus is on improving quality and managing health care costs.
- With **4,688** staff members, Phoenix Children's is among the **40** largest employers in Arizona. In 2016 alone, Phoenix Children's hired **237** new employees.
- Phoenix Children's operates satellite centers and clinic offices in Mesa, Scottsdale, the Northwest Valley, Avondale, Yuma, Tucson and Flagstaff, bringing Phoenix Children's special brand of care closer to home.

Centers of Excellence

Phoenix Children's Heart Center

- Phoenix Children's Heart Center is 1 of only 11 programs in North America to receive the top rating of "three stars" from the Society of Thoracic Surgeons (STS) Congenital Heart Surgery Database because the program's risk adjusted post-surgical mortality rate was statistically lower than the STS expected mortality rate over the last four years.

Barrow Neurological Institute at Phoenix Children's

- Barrow Neurological Institute at Phoenix Children's is Arizona's only Level 4 Pediatric Epilepsy Center - the highest level designated by the National Association of Epilepsy Centers (NAEC). Barrow at Phoenix Children's is also the only pediatric center in Arizona treating epilepsy using a photon laser, which offers minimally invasive surgery alternatives, reduced risk of infection and a significantly reduced recovery time for kids.

The Center of Cancer and Blood Disorders

- The Phoenix Children's Ottosen Family Blood and Marrow Transplant Program, in collaboration with Mayo Clinic in Arizona, is recognized by the National Marrow Donor Program and ranks in the top 10% nationally for all transplant centers for survival after bone marrow transplant.

Phoenix Children's Center of Pediatric Orthopedics

- Phoenix Children's Center for Pediatric Orthopedics has superior surgical management of patients who undergo scoliosis correction surgery, thus minimizing patient complications. In the past year, 0% of patients required readmission within 30 days due to a complication.

ACS-verified Level 1 Pediatric Trauma Center

- Phoenix Children's is building a new Emergency Department and Trauma Center, scheduled to open in fall 2017. The next phase will include 63 exam rooms and expand emergency services capacity to 100,000 patients per year within five years.

Newborn Intensive Care Unit

- The Newborn Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at Phoenix Children's is a Level III nursery, the highest certification given by the Arizona Perinatal Trust. The 30-day readmission rate for the NICU is .79%.
